

At the regular monthly meeting of the Whiteford Township Board, held in the Township Hall at Ottawa Lake, Michigan, on August 19, 1963, a quorum being present: It was moved by John Becker, that Ordinance No. 7, entitled "An Ordinance to Regulate the Transportation of Garbage, Trash, and Rubbish on the Streets and Highways in the Township of Whiteford, Monroe County, Michigan and to Fix a Penalty for the Violation Thereof" be adopted.

It was seconded by Glenn Daniels and after discussion, the question being the adoption of such Ordinance, a majority of the Board having voted therefor, said Ordinance was declared to be adopted.

WHITEFORD TOWNSHIP ORDINANCE NO. 7

An Ordinance to regulate the transportation of garbage, trash and rubbish upon the streets and highways in the Township of Whiteford, Monroe County, Michigan, and to fix a penalty for the violation thereof.

SECTION 1. From and after the effective date of this Ordinance, it shall be unlawful to transport garbage or trash or rubbish over any street or highway in any truck or other vehicle unless the same shall be securely covered to prevent the scattering of such garbage, trash or rubbish or any part thereof on the streets, highways or abutting property. PROVIDED HOWEVER, this provision shall not apply to garbage and trash pickup trucks actively engaged in making garbage and rubbish pickups when the trucks are driven at a speed of not to exceed 20 miles per hour and the pickup points are not to exceed 500 feet apart, and only that part of the truck is left uncovered which is reasonably necessary to permit the accomplishment of such pickups without undue delay. PROVIDED FURTHER that the operator of such garbage and rubbish pickup trucks shall immediately recover and remove any trash, rubbish and garbage which falls off of or is blown off of the truck or other vehicle which is so operating.

SECTION 2. Garbage, as used herein, includes every refuse, accumulation of all waste, animal, fish, fowl, fruit or vegetable matter incident to the preparation, use, cooking, dealing in or storing of meat, fish, fowl, fruit and vegetables, including spoiled food, dead animals, animal manure and fowl manure.

Rubbish as used herein includes all miscellaneous waste materials resulting from housekeeping, mercantile enterprises, trades, manufacturing and offices, including other waste matter such as slag, stone, broken concrete, fly ash, ashes, tin cans, glass, scrap metal, rubber, paper, rags, chemicals, brush, tree limbs, discarded boxes, lumber, or any similar or related combinations thereof.

SECTION 3. Violations of this Ordinance are hereby declared to be a misdemeanor punishable by a fine of not to exceed \$100.00, and the costs of prosecution, or in the default of the payment thereof, by imprisonment in the County Jail for a period of not to exceed ninety (90) days, or by both such fine and imprisonment. Each day that a violation is permitted to exist, shall constitute a separate offense.

SECTION 4. This Ordinance shall become effective forty-five (45) days after its adoption.
