## **ORDINANCE NO. 73**

# TOWNSHIP OF WHITEFORD, COUNTY OF MONROE, STATE OF MICHIGAN WATER SUPPLY CROSS CONNECTION ORDINANCE

An ordinance regulating cross connections with the Whiteford Township public water supply system (i.e. a connection or arrangement of piping or appurtenances through which water of questionable quality, wastes or other contaminants can enter the public water supply system) and the establishment of penalties for violation thereof.

# Be it ordained by Whiteford Township, State of Michigan:

## **SECTION 1. TITLE**

This ordinance shall be known and cited as the Whiteford Township Water Supply Cross Connection Ordinance.

#### SECTION 2. ADOPTION OF ADMINISTRATIVE CODE

Whiteford Township adopts by reference the Water Supply Cross Connection Rules of the Michigan Department of Environmental Quality being R 325.11401 to R 325.11.407 of the Michigan Administrative Code, and any amendments thereto.

#### SECTION 3. INSPECTIONS FOR CROSS CONNECTION

It shall be the duty of Whiteford Township to cause inspections to be made of all properties served by the Whiteford Township public water supply where cross connections with the public water supply is deemed possible. The frequency of inspections and re-inspections based on potential health hazards involved shall be as established by Whiteford Township and as approved by the Michigan Department of Environmental Quality.

#### SECTION 4. REASONABLE ACCESS

A representative of Whiteford Township shall have the right to enter at any reasonable time any property served by a connection to the public water supply system of Whiteford Township for the purpose of inspecting the piping system or systems thereof for cross connections. On request, the owner, lessees, or occupants of any property so served shall furnish to the inspection agency any pertinent information regarding the piping

system or systems on such property. The refusal of such information or refusal of access, requested, shall be deemed evidence of the presence of cross connection.

## SECTION 5. DISCONNECTION OF SERVICE

Whiteford Township is hereby authorized and directed to discontinue water service after reasonable notice to any property where any connection in violation of this ordinance exists and to take such other precautionary measures deemed necessary to eliminate any danger of contamination of the public water supply system. Water service to such property shall not be restored until the cross connection(s) has been eliminated in compliance with the provisions of this ordinance.

#### **SECTION 6. BACKFLOW PREVENTION ASSEMBLIES**

All testable backflow prevention assemblies shall be tested at the time of installation or relocation and after any repair. Subsequent testing of devices shall be conducted at a time interval specified by Whiteford Township and in accordance with Michigan Department of Environmental Quality requirements. Only individuals that hold a valid Michigan plumbing license and have successfully passed an approved backflow testing class or has the ASSE Backflow Testing Certification shall perform such testing. Each tester shall also be approved by the Township of Whiteford. Individual(s) performing assembly testing shall certify the results of his/her testing.

## SECTION 7. LABELING OF NON-POTABLE WATER

The potable water supply made available on the properties served by the public water supply shall be protected from possible contamination as specified by this ordinance and by the state and Monroe County Plumbing Code. Any water outlet which could be used for potable or domestic purposes and which is not supplied by the potable system must be labeled in a conspicuous manner as:

WATER UNSAFE FOR DRINKING

#### SECTION 8. SUPPLEMENTAL NATURE OF ORDINANCE

This ordinance does not supersede the state plumbing code and Monroe County Plumbing Code, but is supplementary to them.

## **SECTION 9. PENALTIES**

Any person or customer found guilty of violating any of the provisions of this ordinance or any written order of Whiteford Township, in pursuance thereof, shall be deemed guilty of a misdemeanor and upon conviction shall be punished by a fine of no less than One Thousand Dollars (\$1,000.00) nor more than Fifteen Hundred Dollars (\$1,500.00) for each violation, plus restitution for costs and expenses incurred by the Township. The severities of the penalties are due to the Township's costs incurred in cleaning up the contamination to the municipal water system. Each day upon which a violation of the provisions of this act shall occur shall be deemed a separate and additional violation for the purpose of this ordinance.

# **SECTION 10. CONFLICTING ORDINANCE(S)**

All Ordinances or parts of Ordinances in conflict herewith are hereby repealed.

## **SECTION 11. EFFECTIVE DATE**

This Ordinance shall become effective thirty (30) days after publication in a newspaper of general circulation within Whiteford Township.
